District Priority 1: Student Learning

- ✓ GYPSD welcomed the <u>Honourable Nathan</u> <u>Cooper, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly</u> of Alberta and MLA for Olds-Didsbury-Three <u>Hills,</u> to Ecole Mountain View School. In addition to explaining <u>Alberta's electoral</u> <u>process</u> to the Grade 6 students, Speaker Cooper:
- Reviewed the roles of <u>municipal</u>, <u>provincial</u> and federal levels of <u>government</u>;
- Shared his role and responsibilities as Speaker of the House; and,
- Led the students thought the <u>lively process</u> of developing a bill into a law.

✓ Students around GYPSD are growing and refining their literacy and numeracy skills as part of the division's Instructional Focus. Recently, Superintendent Lewis celebrated Family Literacy Day with students at Wildwood.

District Priority 2: Teaching and Leadership Excellence

- ✓ Principals are nominating 1st year teachers within GYPSD for this year's Edwin Parr Award.
- Each year the <u>Alberta School Board Association</u> honours six outstanding first-year teachers, from across the province, with the Edwin Parr Teacher Award. Mr. Edwin Parr was a school board Trustee and president of the Alberta School Trustees Association from 1956 – 1962. To honour his legacy, ASBA established this award in his name in 1964.

- GYPSD is proud to claim the past two Edwin Parr award winners!
- ✓ Superintendent Lewis is leading learning at GYPSB and championing for the 42 Rural Boards in Alberta. Highlights include:
- Upcoming meeting with <u>Alberta Education to</u> <u>celebrate GYPSD's 2018-2019 results</u> and to confirm <u>Education Minister Adriana LaGrange's</u> visit in the spring;
- Raising up the complex issues of class size and composition in small schools; and,
- Collaborating with University of Alberta's Dean of Education Jennifer Tupper to address and advocate for more <u>OTs and SLPs.</u>
