Board Priority STUDENT

LEARNING

On behalf of the Board, Chair Karpluk congratulated this year's Grade 12 students writing their final diploma exams in preparation for graduation from high school. She praised their hard work and focus in achieving this "significant milestone" in their learning journey.

Parents were invited to attend an information session to hear how GYPSD is going to provide feedback on specific curricular outcomes on Grades 7-9 report cards. Next year, two schools will pilot the process in advance of a full implementation for 2025. Board Priority 2

TEACHER, SUPPORT STAFF, AND LEADER EXCELLENCE In the Board Chair's Report, Chair Karpuk shared a response from **Minister Nicolaides** regarding Board advocacy around the Teacher Discipline Process. She also reported on the Board's attendance at the annual spring conferences and meetings for the **Public School Boards' Association of Alberta**, the **Rural Caucus of Alberta School Boards**, and the **Alberta School Boards Association**.

Chair Karpluk also shared the Board's appreciation for staff who are retiring, and Trustee Pettitt provided an update of the plans to celebrate this year's retirement cohort and those receiving long-service awards in the fall.

The Board received reports from Director of Human Resources, Meghan Auriat, who provided an update on the required instructional times for each of GYPSD's schools and staff access to the Division's ATA and CUPE Professional Development Growth funds.

In the <u>Superintendent's Report</u>, Dr. Lewis shared highlights of her work, including her attendance at the <u>Edwin Parr Award</u> Banquet with GYPSD's nominee, Paige Ekdahl, and the <u>Superintendent Youth Council's</u> School Improvement Pitch to their principals.

Chair Karpluk recognized **Hinton Trustee Shirley Caputo** whose lifetime contributions to Hinton were acknowledged earlier this month when she was selected to receive the *2024 Senior's Lifetime Achievement Award*.

Inclusive Learning Consultant Amy Corser provided an update on the comprehensive screening taking place in junior kindergarten and kindergarten classrooms, ensuring <u>supports for special learning needs are in place early</u>.

On behalf of the Board, Chair Karpluk shared their deep appreciation for GYPSD staff - wishing everyone a well-earned summer break.

Board Priority COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT Superintendent Lewis chaired the Board's annual <u>Organizational Meeting</u> until the Trustee group selected Trustee Dale Karpluk (Jasper) to serve as the Board Chair for the 2024/25 school year and until the next School Board Trustee Election - scheduled for the Fall of 2025.

Chair Karpluk spoke of the Division's recognition of **National Indigenous History Month**; "Each of our schools have been exploring Indigenous histories, languages, and cultural practices that contribute to student learning and illustrate GYPSD's commitment to Truth and Reconciliation... I encourage everyone who is able to locate a [**National Indigenous Peoples Day**] celebratory event taking place [June 21] in your community and attend."

Board Prioritv SYSTEM HEALTH and WELLNESS

The Board received a comprehensive report describing the Division's commitment to positive mental health and wellness - including the **summer programming** scheduled by the **BEST and Wellness Navigators' team members within each community**.

The report outlined the many initiatives and programs for staff - including the *Guarding Minds at Work* Survey, ASEBP and Inkblot services, and Non-Crisis Intervention Training (NVCI). The report also identified the extensive supports instituted within schools - highlighting the staff (EAs, FSLCs, BEST, and Wellness Navigators) and initiatives such as <u>Hygiene Closets</u>.
